Teacher introduces the timeline 0-old age (drawn on a board).		
Points to raise:		
We all have the same starting point, conception and then birth.		
We are all different and diverge as soon as we are conceived.		
There are lots of similarities about who we are and what happens to us but no two timelines will be identical, even those of identical twins.		
The class then suggests milestones (starting school, GCSEs, prom, job, driving test, marriage, children etc.) on the timeline which volunteers can occupy and which can then have a sound effect. The time line volunteers do a Mexican wave from conception onwards with sound effects as well as movement.		How are these milestones celebrated?
		Is there an expectation that alcohol will be part of these milestones?
		Why/why not?
		What influences our expectations?
